Our Guest speaker this week is **Wendy Verhagen (née Cooper)** (BA 1964, DipEd 1990) is president of WinAccom, a group providing accommodation to support those with mild intellectual disabilities.

WinAccom

In the other project, we have been successful in getting funding for a project officer to help people associated with WinAccom find flexible living opportunities in a range of settings. We will support 24 people with a Disability in the eastern suburbs with daily tasks such as Paying bills, maintaining friendship networks and getting Out and about.

WinAccom is a group of parents of people with disabilities who have been very active in seeking accommodation for their adult offspring. EWTF has been supporting WinAccom in their development (see the 2004 Annual Report). WinAccom is based in the Mount Waverley area, however people participating in the project will come from a slightly wider area.

The Minister for Community Services, Sherryl Garbutt, visited both the Warragul and Oakleigh offices in February to announce funding for EW Tipping Foundation projects under the statewide *Accommodation Innovation Grants* program.

Ms Garbutt said, "We want people with disabilities to have the same opportunity as any other Victorian to enjoy living in the community and in the accommodation of their choice. The E.W.Tipping Foundation has an outstanding record of delivering services to people with a disability and these new projects will assist more people to live independently."

The funding for the Gippsland project will allow local people with disabilities to live independently with support from EWTF in a service which is governed by them and their families.
