Welcome - November 2006



November is Rotary Foundation Month

November is 'Foundation' month, and this means the month to reflect upon the workings of the Rotary Foundation (TRF if you are into acronyms) and the way the Foundation helps Rotary International make the world a better place. To

support Rotary programs the Rotary Foundation must have our support, but did you know that worldwide less than 30% of Rotarians support our Foundation. As your District Governor I am encouraged by the statistic that we have over 400 Foundation Centurions (personal giving of AUD\$100.00 per year) in District 9810, and our Annual Giving through our club goals to the Rotary Foundation has exceeded US\$100.00 Every Rotarian Every Year for the last three years and we are heading toward that goal in 2006-07. We are truly leading the Way.

However, there are other opportunities to support the Rotary Foundation that are less known and that I believe would be of interest to you and more than likely to family, friends and business colleagues. Remember, the good news is that every dollar you contribute to the Rotary Foundation, through the Annual Giving Program is spent, 50% comes back to our District and we spend it through the District Designated Funds and the other half is spent through the World Fund. You may care to know, that in 2005-06 our share of funds from the Foundation, the District Designated Funds, were used to fund 13 literacy projects totally over \$15,000.00 across our district (District Simplified Grants), and 8 Matching Grants utilising over \$24,000.00 from our District Designated Fund. These Matching grants were used to provide bore wells in Guntur, India, RAM netting of 40 Villages in Sohe, PNG, equip the Jabulani Centre in South Africa with stoves, heating etc, and to provide Optical & Dental Surgical Equipment for the Vaiola Hospital in Tonga. In addition we included a fifth member of our Group Study Exchange (GSE) team to France and we funded two cultural scholars. Of course, funds from the Foundation World Fund financed the other members our GSE team and the ongoing study by our World Peace Fellows. Without your support we would not enjoy the benefits of the Rotary Foundation Funding. In addition to giving through the presentation of Paul Harris recognitions, or becoming a Centurion, why not consider becoming a Benefactor, a Bequest Society Member or a Major Donor of the Rotary Foundation. Giving to the Permanent Fund, a fund in which the corpus is never spent and only the interest is used for Foundation programs is a great way to ensure a legacy to Rotary. As past Rotary International President Arch C. Klumph reminded his contemporaries, 'every Rotarian should leave a legacy to the Permanent Fund, in order to do "good in the world"'. At the Foundation Seminar in early August we heard from Rebecca Miller, our nomination as a Rotary Foundation Peace Fellow, I am thrilled to announce that Rebecca' nomination has been accepted by the Rotary Foundation Trustees, the next stage is admission into her nominated Peace Centre course at Bradford in the United Kingdom. I have extended the Districts congratulations and best wishes for the next Stage. December is the Family of Rotary month, an ideal time to enjoy the company of your immediate family and others who have help make a difference to your club and the community. Two MESSAGES from Michael Willis – RAWCS Chair

Hi Bob,

A) D9810 leads the way: again!

The request I passed on from Peter Thomas at the start of October for funds to purchase water tanks for Guadalcanal Island has now been fully funded. South Australian Rotary Clubs had previously agreed to purchase two of the nine water tanks required. Of the remaining seven tanks (total cost \$4900), D9810 Clubs contributed \$3380, ie. D9810 provided more than half the funds required for this project.

The clubs who contributed were:

Mordialloc RC - \$700 - Qty one tank

Croydon RC - \$1280 - With RC of Sunbury, Qty two tanks

RC of Healsville - \$1400 - Qty two tanks

Sincere thanks to those Clubs who contributed. A job very well done.

B) The D9810 surplus stock of 30 Wheelchairs For Kids plus 500 pair of overalls donated by Yakka through Bev foster from the RC of MASH have been despatched to the Solomon Islands together with hospital equipment, computers and school text books from the Geelong and Essendon DIK stores. A further donation of school text books was donated by Fintona Girls School through Tony Kuc from RC of Mash was also included. The usual 'forced labour' from RC of MASH packed the 20 pallet consignment and delivered it to the transport company.

MESSAGE from Keith Rooney on behalf of Eastern Emergency Relief Network

I wonder if you could encourage Rotarians to seek assistance from their club and their staff to contribute to Christmas Hampers (worth approximately \$80 each) for people in need in the Eastern Metropolitan Region (Cities of Boondarah, Knox, Manningham, Maroondah, Monash, Upper Yarra and Whitehorse).

The Eastern Emergency Relief Network distributes Christmas Food Hampers and new toys to these people. They come from many backgrounds and are in desperate circumstances. They approach one of the 110 charity organisations belonging to the Network for urgent assistance. Case Workers assess them and bring them to the Network's Warehouse to obtain a 24 hour emergency food parcel and any furniture or household items they may need.

At Christmas time, the Network distributes food hampers and toys to these people. Last year it was unable to meet the demand in our area - we has a shortfall of about 160 hampers. This year, there has been a 15% increase of people requiring assistance, so we anticipate an increased need for Christmas Hampers and toys!

Any assistance from Rotary Clubs would be much appreciated.
